Rabbi Eric H. Hoffman is the Rabbi and Spiritual Leader of the Fellowship. Rabbi Hoffman has been a teacher and spiritual leader throughout the New York metropolitan area and Fairfield County in Connecticut since he moved here in 1988. Ordained at the Hebrew Union College—Jewish Institute of Religion in New York,



Rabbi Hoffman has served congregations in Cleveland, Brooklyn, and Brookline, Massachusetts. He pursued additional studies in the Judaica department of the Hebrew University and in the Talmud department of the Jewish Theological Seminary in Jerusalem and completed the candidacy requirements for Ph.D. in Talmud at the Hebrew Union College in Cincinnati.

For the past ten years Rabbi Hoffman has trained Rabbinical and Cantorial students at the Academy for Jewish Religion in New York. Throughout his career he has been at the forefront of the movement to reclaim the warmth of tradition and spirituality in Jewish worship and has followed a calling to make traditional Jewish texts immediately accessible to children and adults.

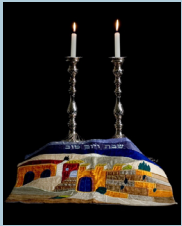
